

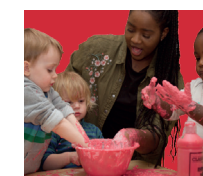
# The Old Firestation is putting together a freelance team to deliver an exciting new project all about the histories of this landmark locally-listed and much loved community building

“The Old Firestation N16, looking out for our community since 1883” is being funded by 9.6k from Historic England’s Everyday Heritage grant programme, celebrating working class histories.

It’s all about discovering and celebrating some of the stories of individuals and organisations involved in the Old Firestation: The last firemen left the building in the 1970s and it reopened as a Community Centre and Nursery in 1982, we think it has been home to at least 25 local community organisations during that time and want to find out more.

We will be working with past and present local community members who will be collecting, communicating and responding to stories from the buildings’ past, present and future in varied ways. We’re planning open day events, and opportunities to learn new skills, as well as interviewing and other research activities.
